Dear Ms. Strach,

I am requesting a comprehensive audit and investigation of the financial records of the campaign committee of Sen. Brent Jackson for apparent violations of campaign finance laws, as described in this letter. There are two sections to my complaint.

1. First, based on my research and conversation with Charles Siska, Jr., who is Sen. Jackson's campaign treasurer and his company's controller, it appears that multiple contributions to Sen. Jackson's campaign from Superior Court Judge Beecher Gray were illegally redesignated as donations from his wife, Sue Gray, in response to a request from Sen. Jackson or Judge Gray. NC General Statute 163A-1428(a) prohibits a donor from making, or a campaign committee from receiving, a contribution "in the name of another individual," including replacing a husband's name with the wife's name. In addition, it is a violation of NCGS 163A-1418(a) for a treasurer to improperly change a donor's name and include that change in an amended campaign disclosure report that the treasurer certifies "as true and correct." In this case, it appears that four donations that Judge Gray made to Sen. Jackson in 2014 and 2015 were redesignated in May 2016 as donations from Sue Gray, and then the treasurer certified amended disclosure reports for the relevant parts of 2014 and 2015 and submitted them to the State Board of Elections and Ethics Enforcement. The changes to the four Beecher donations are the only differences between the original disclosure reports and amended reports submitted in May 2016.

The changes are particularly significant because (a) the North Carolina Code of Judicial Conduct prohibits a Superior Court judge from contributing to a legislator's political campaign, and (b) Judge Gray was the top beneficiary of a decision by the NC Senate Appropriation Committee, co-chaired by Sen. Jackson, to augment the regular longevity bonuses for the salaries of four state judges.

Beecher Gray was a prolific donor during his 28 years as an administrative law judge; an ALJ is not subject to the Code of Judicial Conduct's prohibition against making political contributions. From May 1992 to January 2014, Gray made more than 40 donations to state-level candidates; in the same period, his wife Sue Gray made just one donation recorded in the State Board's database.

Beecher Gray made his first donation to Sen. Jackson in November 2013, about two months before he was appointed a Special Superior Court Judge by Gov. Pat McCrory in January 2014. (Gray and his brother John Gray of Chapel Hill gave a total of \$9,146 to Pat McCrory's 2008 and 2012

gubernatorial campaigns.) After the January 2014 appointment, Judge Gray should have stopped making campaign contributions to candidates.

However, according to Sen. Jackson’s original campaign reports for 2014 and 2015, Beecher Gray (and his brother John) made several donations to Jackson’s campaign leading up to the legislative discussions about the longevity bonus and the decision of the Senate Appropriations Committee to include the bonus supplements in the Senate’s 2017 budget. The added bonus increased Judge Gray’s yearly salary by more than \$30,000, according to a WRAL news story – see: <https://www.wral.com/senate-budget-helps-connected-judges-/16721756/>

Here is a spreadsheet of the campaign contributions from the Gray family to Sen. Jackson. I have highlighted in **bold type** the four contributions in 2014 and 2015 that were originally attributed to Beecher Gray that were later attributed to Sue Gray in amended disclosure reports:

The combined total of \$25,700 contributed by Beecher, Sue and John Gray to Sen. Brent Jackson is

by far the most the trio has given over the past 30 years to any NC legislative candidate, including NC Senate leader Phil E. Berger, Sr. According to the WRAL report, Sen. Berger and Beecher Gray were law school classmates in an accelerated program at Wake Forest University.

Significantly, Beecher Gray is listed as donating \$1,000 to Sen. Berger on October 2, 2014 – nine months after Gray’s appointment as a Superior Court judge – but unlike the \$1,000 donation to Sen. Jackson in October 2014, the donation to Berger has not been changed. The campaign treasurer for Sen. Berger did not file an amended report, and the \$1,000 contribution from Judge Gray remains on Berger’s campaign disclosure report of record for the Third Quarter Plus period of 2014. By contrast, a December 2015 contribution of \$1,000 to then-Gov. Pat McCrory was first attributed to Judge Beecher Gray on McCrory’s campaign report, but an amended report that reassigned the donation to Sue Gray was filed by McCrory’s treasurer in March 2016.

It’s likely that the Jackson and McCrory committees filed their amended reports in the spring of 2016 because independent investigator Greg Flynn posted a report on his blog on February 22, 2016, that raised questions about Gray’s contributions in 2014 and 2015 and possible violations of the Code of Judicial Conduct – see: <https://gregflynn.wordpress.com/2016/02/22/shades-of-gray-mccrory-appointed-judge-candidate-contributions/>

I am asking the State Board of Elections to obtain and examine copies of the four checks for the redesignated contributions to Sen. Brent Jackson in order to determine who signed them and whether campaign finance statutes were violated. Charles Siska Jr., Sen. Jackson’s campaign treasurer, told me that he routinely keeps copies of contribution checks and retains them going back many years. The McCrory and Berger campaigns and the Gray family should also cooperate with an investigation by the State Board into the accuracy of the disclosure of contributions made by Judge Gray after January 2014. It is important for the public to know definitively whether or not Judge Gray made contributions after his appointment as Superior Court judge and whether or not he or Sen. Jackson or others were involved in improperly changing the donor of a contribution.

2. My second concern about Sen. Jackson’s campaign reports raises more questions about their accuracy and truthfulness. Sen. Jackson owns a farming operation in Duplin County and many of his campaign contributors are farmers. However, upon examining his campaign reports for the past four years, I find dozens of contributions with “Farmer, Self Employed” listed in the occupation and employer fields on the disclosure reports for donors who are not farmers. For example:

- ▶ John McCauley contributed \$5,200 to the Jackson campaign in October 2018. He is identified as a “Farmer” on the disclosure report, but he is the chief executive officer of Highland Paving in Fayetteville, a major construction and paving company with contracts with the NC Department of Transportation. Two other top officials with Highland Paving who donated to Sen. Jackson are correctly identified, but not CEO John McCauley.

- ▶ Robert Barnhill Jr. of Barnhill Contracting Company, another major DOT contractor, gave Sen. Jackson \$500 in October 2018. Barnhill is one of the North Carolina’s most prolific donors, and he is correctly identified on dozens of campaign reports in the State Board of Elections’ database as an executive with Barnhill Contracting. The Jackson campaign is the only committee that lists him as a self-employed “Farmer.”

► Rickie Day, president of Martin Edwards & Associates, donated \$10,400 to Sen. Jackson's 2017-2018 campaign, the maximum allowed; he is listed as "Farmer, Self Employed." He has contributed to many other state legislators (none identify him as a farmer), and his company has been under intense scrutiny for mismanaging a lucrative state contract for towing, storing and auctioning the cars of DWI-impaired and other law-offending drivers.

► Charles F. Fuller gave nearly \$8,500 to Sen. Jackson in seven donations from March 2015 to March 2018; he is listed as "Farmer, Self Employed" for each donation. But he is actually a former lobbyist and Congressional staffer and now CEO of The Results Company in Raleigh, which specializes in winning favorable government policies for its business clients. The company's website claims it was "at the forefront helping shape the debate in NC that resulted in the most comprehensive state-level tax reform in the country."

► Greg Jennings of Durham, another misidentified "Farmer," contributed \$1,000 to Sen. Jackson in April 2018. Jennings owns an engineering consulting firm and contracts with the Resource Institute, which has managed numerous stream restoration and eco-engineering projects in the state. Also in April 2018, Jennings gave \$2,000 each to Sen. Harry Brown and Rep. Kyle Hall, two key budget writers in their chambers. Those were Jennings' first recorded donations in North Carolina. About a month later, the General Assembly adopted a state budget with an unusual provision that granted \$5 million to the Resource Institute "to explore opportunities for the development and implementation of emerging techniques that can extend the useful life of beach nourishment projects." The \$5 million grant is more surprising because it turns out the Resource Institute has no experience with beach nourishment or oceanfront engineering; however, it also turns out that Jennings' donations were part of over \$100,000 that a dozen officials with the firm and its contractors gave state legislators from Feb. 2016 to April 2018. NC Policy Watch carefully documented this apparent sweetheart deal that bypassed the NC Department of Environmental Quality and shocked coastal engineers and scientists – see: <http://www.ncpolicywatch.com/2018/07/26/pw-exclusive-beach-nourishment-bingo/> and <http://pulse.ncpolicywatch.org/2018/07/27/go-backstage-how-i-got-the-resource-institute-story-plus-a-guide-to-documents-for-budding-sleuths-citizen-journalists/>

By misidentifying donors with major interests in state contracts and the state budget, Sen. Jackson and his campaign deceive the public, falsely inflate his financial support from farmers, and violate campaign disclosure laws. A few mistakes are understandable, but such a large number of cases where "Farmer, Self Employed" hides a donor's principal economic identity is inexcusable.

More than 80 examples of wrongly identified contributions are listed on the spreadsheet on pages 6-8 of this letter; they add up to more than \$80,000 for Sen. Jackson's 2016 and 2018 campaigns. The contributors include beer and wine wholesalers, optometrists, energy company executives, retail store owners, builders, pharmacists, insurance company officials, manufacturers, healthcare administrators, and attorneys.

Charles Siska Jr., the Jackson campaign treasurer, told me he has little trouble filling in donors' occupational information on disclosure reports because that information is provided to him on forms that come with the donations. It would certainly be unfortunate if Sen. Jackson has a role in misidentifying his contributors.

I am asking the State Board to investigate thoroughly how and why so many Jackson donors are wrongly identified and to hold accountable all those responsible for this deceptive practice. The Board should also direct the Jackson committee to file new, corrected reports for at least the past six years. That directive, along with appropriate penalties, would perhaps encourage Sen. Jackson and others to respect the fact that truthful and complete disclosure of the money involved in the public elections process is vital to a free and fair democracy of, by, and for the people.

I look forward to your investigation of these matters.
